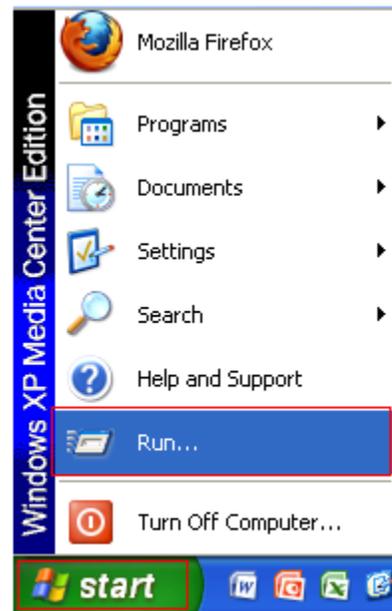


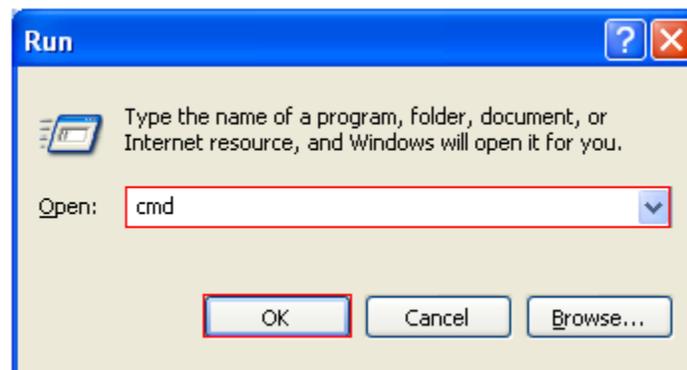
Finding your network address for wireless devices:

- **Windows 2000 / XP (Vista and Windows 7 see page 3.)**

1. Click the **Start button** on the windows taskbar. Select the **Run** option.
  - a. If **Run** is not found here, you can go to **Start, Programs (All Programs), Accessories, Command Prompt**. Proceed to step 3 if applicable.



2. The **Run** window will pop up. Type the letters **cmd** and click **ok** or press enter.



3. The command prompt utility will pop up. Type the letters **ipconfig /all** and press enter.

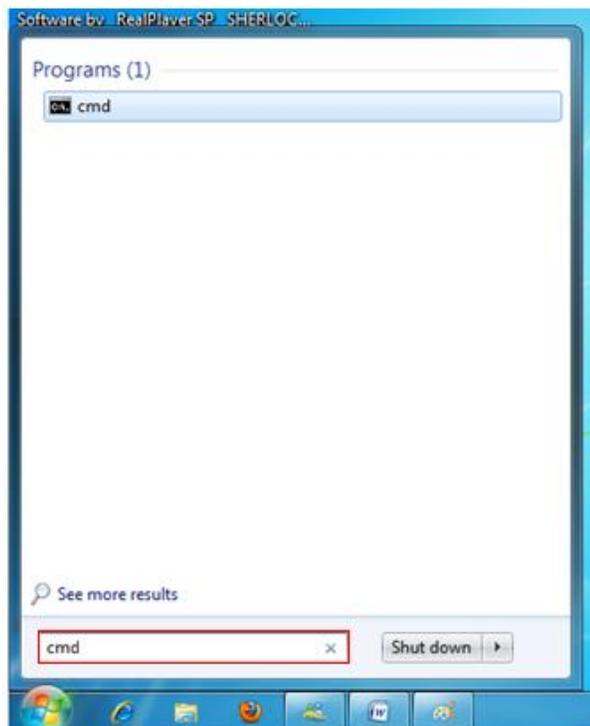

- **Windows Vista / Windows 7**

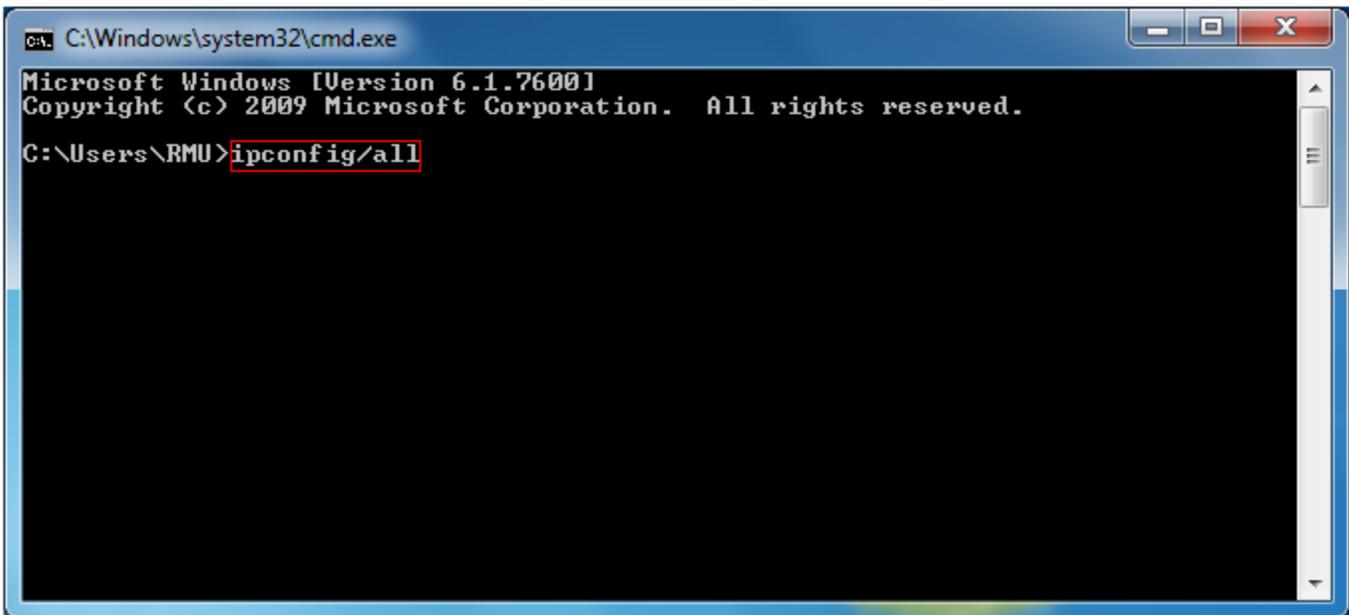
1. Click the **Start button** on the windows taskbar.



2. Click in the **Search** field and type **cmd**. Depending on your settings, you may have to right-click the cmd program and run as administrator).



- The command prompt utility will pop up. Type the letters **ipconfig /all** and press enter.

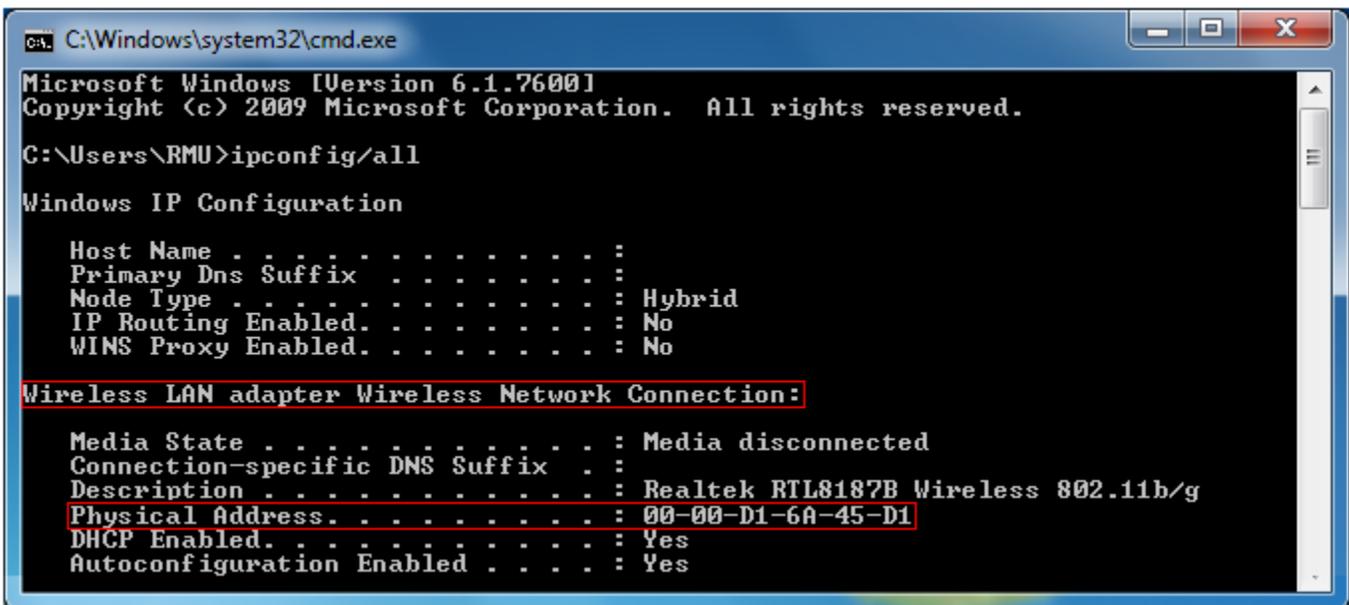
